Staff Professional Learning

Teachers and Integration Aides will be completing the Abilities Based Learning and Education Support (ABLES) program on our Pupil Free Day. The ABLES program supports the teaching and learning of students with disabilities and additional needs. It provides a suite of curriculum, assessment and reporting resources that assist teachers in recognising and responding to the diverse learning needs of all students.

A number of staff have also been working through an online learning course to improve knowledge around Dyslexia and other significant reading difficulties.

Liz has completed training to assist our school to implement the eSmart School Initiative. The framework is designed to help schools to improve cybersafety and reduce cyberbullying and bullying.

Nick has recently attended the State MARC/MACC conference where he was involved in professional learning to improve the delivery of his lesson with a strong literature focus. This was also an excellent opportunity to network with other teachers and share ideas to assist with improving the program.
