Acceptable Usage Agreement

Working Together for Safe and Responsible Technology Use

At Tawonga Primary School we are committed to ensuring that all students use digital technologies safely, respectfully, and responsibly. Our Acceptable Usage Agreement outlines the expectations for how students access and use school devices, the internet, and online learning platforms.

The Acceptable Usage Agreement helps students understand:

- How to be safe and respectful online
- Why privacy and cyber-safety matter

To support this, we ask parents and carers to review the agreement with their child, discuss its importance, and return the signed form by the end of the week. By working together, we can ensure that our students develop strong digital citizenship skills and a positive approach to technology.

Bushfire Preparedness

Dear Families,

We want to let you know about our school's emergency management plan. Our school plans for a range of hazards, such as bushfire, severe weather, medical emergencies, building fires, intruders, etc. We develop specific response procedures to address these risks.

We also conduct drills regularly, ensuring that our core procedures of on-site and off-site evacuation, sheltering-in-place, and lockdown/lockouts are well-rehearsed and understood by staff and students.

Our school is considered at risk of bushfire or grassfire. We are Category 3 on the Bushfire At-Risk Register/ Category 4 List. This means that we will **close** when the fire danger rating is **Extreme** in our local government area (LGA) – Alpine. Our school will **close** on days of **Catastrophic** fire danger in the Alpine district.

If we enact our emergency management plan, we will notify you by email / Compass notification. with updates on our actions. Please do not come to the school unless directed to do so, as you may put yourself and others in danger. If there is anything we need you to do, we will let you know.

In the event of an emergency that impacts telecommunications, we will endeavour to update you by other means.

During an emergency, the school will work closely with emergency services to get specific advice to keep our community safe. Additionally, the Department of Education has dedicated emergency management staff to help monitor the situation and provide additional support to schools during emergencies.


