
Jobs - topping up soil in our raised veggie garden beds, moving some sand into the sandpit, moving some grit into the base of the chicken coop and some weeding.

Swimming

Our end of year swimming program will commence on Monday 17th November. Students will travel via bus to the Mt Beauty Pool and participate in a 30 minute lesson.

A few things that may help:

- Goggles are really useful
- All students need a rash top, towel and bathers in a separate bag
- Long hair tied back out of the face
- Thongs, Crocs or river shoes for before and after swimming
- If it is raining, the program will go ahead. Thunderstorms will be the deciding factor. The pool will advise us.

Parents are required to pick up from the pool between 3-3.15pm. Our lessons finish at 3pm with the pool opening to the general public at 3.30pm. Families wishing to take advantage of this are welcome to stay, which will save on changing.

- **Students needing to catch the school bus will catch the bus from Mt Beauty SC.
- **Students with an OSHC booking will need to make prior arrangements with Mrs Franzke before 9am on a swim day. This is to ensure that enough seats are available in staff cars. If your child needs a booster seat let us know as the school only has one.
- **Students wishing to make their own way home, eg walk or ride, will need to provide a note signed by a parent.
