Cluster Athletics Years 3/6

Monday 1st April - Time: 9:15am - 2.30pm - Year 3-6

Year 3 to 6 students will be a part of the combined school's athletic carnival at the Les Peart Oval in Mt Beauty. Primary school students from Dederang to Falls Creek will enjoy a day of activities. All students in years 3 to 6 will be competing within their house teams. Students will be competing for the opportunity to represent our Cluster at the Divisional Athletics Sports later in the year.

Arrangements for transport will be exactly the same as for the swimming sports earlier this term: bus students can stay on the buses until they arrive at Mt Beauty where they will be met by a teacher. All other students need to be taken by parents directly to the oval. Children not picked up by parents by 3pm will be brought back to Tawonga on the school buses, arriving about 3:40pm and then placed into OSHC. Children are asked to dress in house colours, as this adds to the fun and the atmosphere on the day.

Students to come dressed in house colours (the same as per swimming sports day).

All students will need a hat, lunch, a water bottle, suitable shoes and a jumper in case it's cool. The day is likely to finish early. Pick up by parents will be permitted at the conclusion of the sports. Parents and carers are most welcome to come along on the day to cheer and support students.

If any parents or carers are available to help time keep, marshal, record or run an event on the day, please let us know. These events run more smoothly with the extra assistance from parents.

Meal Deal will be the same as last year. \$5 will get you sausages, a drink, piece of fruit and icy pole. Bring your money on the day.
